WHY? The Oceania EcoHealth Chapter Co-Creation Stream is an interactive eco-social program. By providing local context and relevance, delegates have the opportunity to engage with local people, places and spaces that make ecosystem approaches to health exciting and relevant.

WHAT? Planning has commenced for activities to occur around the Congress including:

- Pre-Congress workshop (3 Dec): a 'priming' workshop to be hosted at the University of Melbourne involving site visits to the Yarra River and elsewhere.
- Welcome to Country (and related activities)
- A booth for coordinating activities, providing information, reporting ongoing outcomes
- Scaled activities each day of the Congress leading to the production of a Congress Statement on the contributions that can be made by regional approaches to the health and nature agenda. Proposed activities include:
 - > City Walks/Yarra walk, Yarra River cruise
 - > Breakfast talks and related events
 - > Opportunities to engage with Koori heritage and Elders
 - > An Art competition for a logo for Oceania EcoHealth Chapter,
 - > Oceania Dinner/celebratory event after the IAEH Biennial General Meeting.
- Profiling students: a NextGen night with a Pecha Kucha competition and prizes for two best presentations to be featured in the Plenary programme
- A commitment to engage with diverse voices from people across the Oceania region about caring for country, climate change and sustainability.
- Integrative activities profiling of delegates, and co-hosting of IAEH events.
- Post-conference half/full day field trips in conjunction with Parks Victoria.
